The PINEAPPLE has long been used as a symbol of HOSPITALITY or WELCOME. A fruit only grown in tropic climates did not keep well on long sailing voyages, meaning the expensive fruit was limited to those with power and money. Offering the rare and sweet delicacy to a guest upon arrival was the ultimate expression of WELCOME. You can find symbols of pineapples in older hotels and homes.


